Highlights of the new school year:

- The school held a successful meet the staff BBQ on September 12. Despite the overwhelming attendance by families, everyone was fed and the meet and greet with teachers was a success. Due to the popularity of the BBQ, the school administration is considering holding the BBQ day prior to school openning day because the current setup can be disruptive as it happens on a school day and teachers will not have any updates to share with parents as they would still be settling into their classes. Other schools host BBQ days in August and that is becoming the norm.
 - The school is also considering buying its own grill, rather than rely on rentals.
- The school will hold 6 fire drills and 3 lockdown drills throughout the school year.

- Among other regular events, classes will receive Parish visits, there will be a Dance Residency, and a Rapunzeel theatre performance on October 8th.
- Other notable events include;
 - Picture Day on October 15th.
 - Demonstration of Learning on November 28th,
 - Skiing Field Trip for Grades 4-6 on December 6th and
 - The Christmas Concert on December 17th.
- The school's student capacity has increased from 350 students last year to 460 in the current school year. The current grade breakdown is:
 - 92 students in 3 kindergarten classes,
 - 60 students in 3 classes each for grades 1 to 4,
 - 45 students in grade 5, and
 - 35 students in grade 6.
 - The current capacity allows for an expected influx later in the year of new students from new homes that are currently being completed in the Orchards neighbourhood.
